



Using a Partner Vet for TNR

- 1 After you have met with an FFF representative for a trapping lesson and have been approved to begin the program, call one of the partner vets' offices to set up an appointment for a date that is convenient for you. The vets that currently partner with FFF are:
 - Forsyth Vet, 2556 S. Stratford Rd., Winston-Salem, NC 27103, 336-765-1225
 - Animal Hospital of Lewisville, 6260 Shallowford Rd, Lewisville, NC 27023, 336-946-3441
- 2 When you schedule your appointment, please let the office know that the cats are part of the FFF program. Make sure to give them your colony tracking ID, which will be provided to you through the FFF representative who is assisting you. The cats in each colony will be assigned numbers in the order of which they are caught. If you change vets during the process of trapping, continue the number sequence you used at the previous vet. Do not start over with number 1.
- 3 Always let your FFF representative know as soon as you schedule an appointment. FFF must know in advance to ensure that the proper supplies are provided to the vet before the appointment.
- 4 Trapping should occur the afternoon or evening before the scheduled appointment. If you are unable to catch your cats, please call the vet first thing in the morning to let them know that you need to cancel the appointment. See our separate handouts *Trapping Cats for the TNR Program* and *Trapping Tips*.
- 5 Cats should be transported to the vet at the assigned time on the morning of the appointment. They will remain at the office for the day, and they will need to be picked up at the end of the same business day. Drop off and Pick up times will be provided by each individual vet's office. Cats must be transported in approved traps. *Carriers cannot be used, even if the cat is friendly.*
- 6 Cats will receive the following care as a part of the TNR package:
 - Spay or neuter surgery
 - Rabies vaccine
 - Distemper vaccine
 - Microchip implant which will be registered to FFF
 - Ear tip or notch for easy identification
 - Frontline flea treatment application
- 7 Any other charges or services can only be authorized through FFF's Director. Please talk to your FFF representative if you feel that additional services are warranted. Unauthorized charges to FFF's bill will, in turn, be billed to you.
- 8 Please do not make any payments directly to the vets' offices. FFF has one account and makes payments weekly to avoid confusion with people paying for individual cats. Please send all payments/donations to:
